News came out yesterday that GB Food, a British-Chinese joint venture food manufacturer, is navigating the incentives approval process with their eyes on Heath. The Port Authority's 20,000 sq. ft. industrial building, built on speculation, is the location that is on their radar screen. The news tends to validate the risk-taking economic development model embraced by the Port Authority that has seen five spec buildings built since 2011 at the Aerospace Center and a sixth slated to be ready later this year.
