



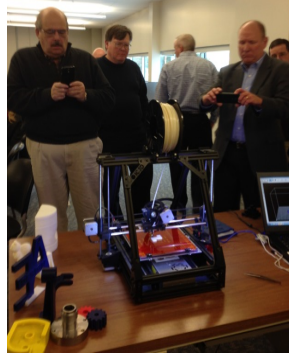

3D Printing Partnership Begun

Manufacturers got to hear from C-TEC students in the design class who have been using a 3D printer from Central Ohio-based IC3D yesterday. The printer is one of three provided by the Port Authority to a new 3D printer partnership being kicked off formally later this month. The Port Authority is leasing the equipment to C-TEC and The Works and providing supplies for the machines as a way to introduce the new technology to Licking County in a bold, visible way.
