- The major reconstruction of the North Entry to the Aerospace Center starts this coming Monday. Though an inconvenience to parking routines and visitors, the final product will be a modern bridge with a long-time life.
- The first construction began Monday of this week for build-out of the second floor of the Horton Building to house the offices for the AFMETCAL program. The building should be ready for occupancy in early 3Q 2015.
- With the ground thawing, site work for the MISTRAS Group new building at James Parkway and Kaiser Drive is now in high gear. Concrete trucks are next in line with structural panels and steel not far behind.
